

Grading operations are currently underway for the North Railroad expansion at the Port of Wilmington, representing an important phase in the project's development. This effort consists of extensive earthwork and site preparation to support the installation of additional rail infrastructure. Upon completion, the expansion will add new rail lines that increase capacity and enhance operational efficiency at the Port. The project plays a key role in supporting the Port of Wilmington's long-term growth and its ability to accommodate increased rail and cargo demand.
