

CMT-RAIL EXPANSION

Carolina Marine Terminal continues to strengthen its logistics capabilities with the completion of a new rail expansion. The project added a third rail line, increasing capacity from two to three active tracks to support higher freight volumes and improve on-site efficiency. In addition, a new switch connection was installed to tie directly into the mainline, enhancing accessibility and flow of materials. This upgrade positions the terminal for continued growth, optimizing operations and ensuring seamless rail service for customers across the region.
